Scope and Method

Arch 201 Arch. Design Studio I is the first step of the chain of design studios. In this phase, students are expected to achieve an analysis Site and Architectural Program to establish a language to be used in their design and to accomplish the design of the building. Arch 201 is a non-exam course (Article 24-2 of university's regulation); therefore grading will be made according to the work performed by the student during the term. The term will be divided into stages, each one comprising a different phase of the project. The development of the project will be monitored through synchronized critics. Students will have to present their work several times as shown in the timetable to the synchronized critics in order to get a grade for each stage.

The method and the process used in the formation of the project are considered to be more important than the final design presented to the final jury. Therefore, students will be expected to be present at the synchronized meeting, present their work to the meeting participate to discussions during synchronized critics. Class hours will be essentially used for criticizing the work achieved by the students at home and not for drawing projects.

Students will have to make a minimum number of synchronized meeting presentations in order to get a grade for stage; those failing to fulfill this requirement will not receive a grade for the relevant period. More presentations will certainly help the improvement of the project; therefore increase the chance of receiving better grades.

Topic: Designing a group of BUNGALOW in a forest, nearby a little lake (At least 10 Unit)

The work required for each stage is as follows:

Preliminary work

- a. Analysis of the topic & given site plan & Architectural Program (Graphic Presentation)
- b. Model of the site 1/500

Stage 1: Conceptual design

a.	Site Plan & Ssections	1/200	(Local)
b.	Plan or Plans	1/100	(A group of units)
c.	Sections	1/100	
d.	Elevations	1/100	

Stage 2: Final Design

a.	Floor plan or plans	1/50
b.	Sections	1/50
c.	Elevations	1/50

e. Model (Site & One Unit) 1/500 – 1/50
